Attendance

Actions:

- Promoting the message 'EVERY LESSON COUNTS'.
- Accurate recording of attendance on VSware at the beginning of each class.
- Use the student journal to record lates to class, absence and missed tests. Teachers to note and flag patterns and trends around previous - lates, absence and missed tests. Subject teacher to report ongoing patterns of absences/lates to the year head.
- Use the student journal to communicate positive behaviour and areas of concern with parents.
- Year heads to work in conjunction with the attendance officer and Vsware to track attendance on a weekly/monthly basis.
- A reward system for the student of the month and improved attendance.

Transitions

- Increased awareness from subject departments on the transitions from Primary to Secondary level
- Events such as Open Day/ Open Night/ Transfer Day & Friendship Day to ease the move from Primary
- Increased awareness from subject departments on the transitions from junior to senior cycle in their relevant subject areas.
- Careers fair to equip students with the knowledge they need to make informed decisions around subject choice and possible career choices.

Actions:

- Key words will be displayed in each classroom and teachers will highlight 3 spelling mistakes when correcting work for students to self correct.
- Each department will help students decode the literacy of examination language - common approach by all departments. Box instruction, underline the key words and glance over the question again (BUG strategy)
- Coordinated approach to correcting of work e.g. 2 stars and a wish and formative feedback
- New library Book in a bag all students will carry reading material - books - fiction/non fiction/ Farmers Journal - Reading awards & competitions

- Standard test cover sheet for wholeschool BUG strategy

 Breakdown of results per question, Teacher feedback student feedback linked back to diary. Include also the predicted and actual grade. Completed cover sheet to be signed by parents.
- Problem solving posters in all rooms. New graphing strategies.
- Metric system common approach by all departments -Posters for measurements and units in all classrooms.
- Predicted grade and actual working out the percentage difference between what they predicted and what they got.
- Encourage more active methodologies e.g. conducting a survey and analysing results.



The state examination that students sit in their subject at the end of their junior cycle will also be graded differently. Instead of A, B, C, D, E, F and NG the following descriptors will now be used:
















How Parents can support their Children

How Parents can support their Children



- Get spare locker keys cut.
- Check that homework is completed and sign the journal. Check for any notes from teachers
