





- □ Generally most settle in quickly
- Most anxieties are diminished by the end of day one
- Research shows that Open Nights and Transfer Days greatly reduce the stress of transferring
- Majority have settled in by end of the first week
- **25% take a month**
- □ 1 in 6 will take longer
- □ Girls take longer than boys
- Students will progress better in a mixed ability setting regardless of their ability
